Commentary

Deliverables Progress
Jobs: 186 jobs have been reported in this quarter, and 13 apprenticeships. The figures are lower than anticpated, however, we are seeing the impacts of the prolonged COVID lockdown. Some providers have reported fewer apprenticeships, in cthe current pandemic.

Skills Floorspace: We can record that further skills providers have practically completed floorspace 4,567 m2 as part of our skills capital programme. A number of schemes remain in delivery, and are expected to complete on site by 31/03/2021.

Learner numbers: Learner numbers are at 312 for Q3. This is positive given that a number of providers are currently teaching via on line learning portals only.

Transport data: Our transport outputs have increased within period. This is largely attributed to aspects of the Halsnead project now being reported as complete on site.

Project RAG ratings

Positively, the programme continues to have no RED rated projects. This has been a positive trend since the Q4 return. The number of projects now rated at Amber/Red has decreased from the 3 reported in Q2 to 2 in Q3. The number of amber rated projects has increased from to 8 in Q2 to 12 in Q3. This is not unexpected, given delays reported as a consequence of the COVID 19 panedemic.

Financial progress

The LCRCA operates devolved funding as a 'single pot', affording us the flexibility to switch project funding as needed to ensure the portfolio is optimised at all times. Further, in recognition that some projects fall into distress at various points in the project filecycle, we have routinely over-programmed against our funding posts such that we can be assured of meeting spending commitments if not project completions. This return shows that strategy—the value of projects booked to LGF is greater than the value of the LGF award. Our position, as all December 2020, is an over commitment against the total LGF budget available of £8.4m. If delivery schedules are impacted on any specific schemes, especially given the impact of COVID, we are able to utilise orthing sources available to us to ensure such project can continue with the outpast all over allocation (E327.9m), the table with the outpast allocations. In Q3, £11.6m has been disbursed against the original annual forecast of £84.1m. Our annual award for 20/21 was £87.7 million. We are currently on target to be able to disburse this. We require no further contractual commitments to be made to enable us to achieve the award value and we are currently forecasts the LGF allocations to be disbursed by March 21, with projects completed using alternative funds after this date.
